The most compelling service outcome of an innovative and collaborative mental health program collaboration is the improved mental health of children 0-5.

- a) 287 children received relationship-based mental health services
- b) The parents of 92% (238/259) of the reported children indicated improved mental health symptoms
- c) The clinicians of 85% (187/220) of the reported children indicated improved mental health symptoms

These indicators of improved mental health are significant because not only are children clinically improving, but parents are seeing a difference which positively affects family dynamics.

Provide a description of the evaluation activities completed during the fiscal year

The Stanislaus County Children and Families Commission views evaluation as both a process and a tool. The process of evaluation is fluid and occurs throughout the fiscal year, encompassing multiple methods and activities. Evaluation as a tool informs stakeholders and assists in decision making. As both process and tool, the primary focus of the SCCFC evaluation is promoting a learning environment. The learning occurs when evaluation information is shared: effective and ineffective practices; impacts on children, families, and communities; costs and benefits of programs; and the contributions of programs towards achieving population results expressed in the SCCFC Strategic Plan.

The SCCFC strategic plan is the foundation for any given fiscal year's evaluation cycle, as it communicates the Commission's goals, objectives, and strategies. The evaluation activities begin as each funded program addresses the Strategic Plan through its activities and planned outcomes, which are articulated in a Scope of Work (SOW) developed at the start of the fiscal year. The SOW becomes the basis for each program's SCOARRS (Stanislaus County Outcomes and Results Reporting Sheet), and both inform and document the services performed, resources used, data collected, and outcomes expected. Both documents are constructed jointly between Commission staff and program staff, and each draws on the unique capacity of the programs to contribute to the Commission's goals and objectives. Both documents also serve as blueprints for programs and the Commission to mutually understand how resources will turn into results.

Quantitative and qualitative data are collected through each individual program's SCOARRS, which provides a structured framework for tracking and reporting data and outcomes. SCOARRS are submitted quarterly by all programs and contribute to the effective monitoring of each program on a quarterly basis. SCOARRS data also supply programs with information to learn what is working well and what improvements can be made throughout the fiscal year, and allows programs to explain and/or revise practices.

The Commission and programs continuously evaluate programs throughout the yearly evaluation cycle, utilizing both qualitative and quantitative methods of collecting, analyzing, and reporting data. A variety of tools provide the programs and Commission with program data, including the following: pre/post tests, customer satisfaction surveys, employee satisfaction surveys, observations, intakes, and screenings. Programs capture output and outcome data in SCOARRS, and demographic data in PEDS. Commission staff then incorporates this information, along with information from budgets, invoices, site visits, interviews, and narrative annual reports to evaluate individual program effectiveness, as well as overall aggregate progress towards Commission goals and objectives.

Efforts to measure and evaluate leveraging and collaboration also continued during 2010-2011. A collaboration matrix tool has been utilized since 2009-2010, assessing the level of collaboration occurring between Commission partners. Results have been shared, and opportunities to increase collaboration have been supported. Leveraging is part of many programs' sustainability plans, and has also been measured and supported.

The 2010-2011 evaluation reveals findings in all four of the Commission's priority result areas. The following is a summary of results for each result area.

*11,193 children's families received support services through countywide Family Resource Centers, Healthy Start sites, and 2-1-1. These services include parent training, resource and referrals, and basic needs assistance

The policy impact of the evaluation results will not be fully realized until the program evaluation report for 2010-2011 is completed. As in previous years, the Commission plans to use the evaluation results as just one of multiple tools to make decisions regarding the funding of programs for the 2012-2013 fiscal year. However, since there will be substantially greater program funding cuts for '12-'13 than in previous years due to AB99 and the continuing decline in Prop 10 revenues, the evaluation is expected to have even greater impacts on the Commission's decision making process.

Although complete results are not yet finalized, the evaluation process was used throughout the year to inform policy decisions on multiple levels. Funded programs receive evaluation feedback throughout the year as part of the evaluation cycle feedback loop. The SCOARRS, Annual Report, and Site Visit Reports serve as reflective reporting tools through which programs review what is working well and where challenges remain. This self-examination, along with reviews and discussions with Commission staff, inform programs to take action to revise methods and/or services. This process continues to be valuable for both programs and the Commission.

The Commission receives evaluation updates in several forms. This Annual Report submission, a comprehensive Annual Program Evaluation, and the State Annual Report provide the Commission with information to assist in the decisions regarding short and long-term budgeting, making recommendations about programs, and revising and updating its strategic plan. Evaluation information continues to influence decisions regarding the prioritization of strategies, services, and allocation of diminishing resources. For example, the Commission confirmed the Annual Evaluation's summary that Result Area 1 outcomes were a priority, and continued funding programs at a high level in that result area for the '11-'12 fiscal year.

The dissemination of evaluation results to a multitude of stakeholders is essential to increase awareness of how Prop 10 funding is accounted for, and to impact local and state policy. The Commission distributes information through the "Report to the Community," which relays results of the work being done with local Prop 10 funding in a "user-friendly" manner. In 2010 the report reached a wide variety of stakeholders through local newspapers and partners, providing over 241,000 stakeholders with narratives, demographics, and outcomes of services. As the information reaches the community, local policy and advocacy efforts can be influenced (e.g., creating buy-in from local businesses or governments). A presentation, which is based on the "Report to the Community," was also given to the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors, creating additional awareness and support at the County policy level. Information has also been shared with State Senator staff in order to influence state policy and budget.

Evaluation Purpose

The purpose of the 2010-2011 SR evaluation was to identify improvements in the result areas and funded services as specified in the SR logic model, as well as to gain and relay insights on possible program improvements through process evaluation.

The following result areas/funded services were identified:

-Improved Family Functioning, as indicated by adopting desired family practices (i.e., participation in adult education, meeting with Kindergarten teachers, reading to children)

-Improved Child Development, as indicated by access to early childhood education opportunities (i.e., participation in social skills classes, receiving developmental screenings, and regular attendance at an ECE program)

-Improved Child Health, as indicated by access to medical, behavioral, and other health screenings and health insurance (i.e., participation in screenings, and enrollment in insurance)

Evaluation Method

Since only one school district received School Readiness funding for the 2010-2011 fiscal year and less funding was available, the evaluation that has been completed for 8 years in Stanislaus County by a CSU Stanislaus team was discontinued. The one remaining site was asked to collect evaluation data, and submit results and a narrative for their program. The evaluation method included the collection of demographic statistics, service participation data, and qualitative data from participants. This data was summarized in an annual report submitted to the Commission to document the effects of the program on participating children and families.

The SR site collected data from all families participating in program services after working with families to identify the SR-funded services received by each family and child.

Measurement Technique

The program utilized a database to document participation and access to SR services. Observation and feedback from clinicians and teachers were also utilized to document change and results.

Sample Selection

No sample selection was used. Data was collected and analyzed from all participating SR families.

Data Processing

The data was collected, entered into a database, and reported. The data was then summarized in an annual report narrative format. Limited data from the site was available to measure improvement from 2009-2010 to 2010-2011. Comparison group data was not available.

Conclusions

The evaluation conclusions are quite limited for 2010-2011 due to the lack of comparison data and incomplete data collection. The following are results and site improvements (compared to '09-'10):

- 1) 7.1% increase in the percent of children receiving health checks - 100% (150) of the participating children
- 2) 9.8% increase in the percent of children regularly attending an ECE program - 100% (150) of the participating children
- 3) 100% of the participating families reported reading or telling stories regularly to their children
- 4) 98% of the participating children have health insurance
- 5) Mental health services were highly effective in improving social-emotional K-readiness skills (qualitative observations)

These results indicate positive changes for children and families' readiness for school. However, it is recommended that the site focus on encouraging families to become more involved with their children's Kindergarten and school (only 42% report activity in this area).

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
